# A Message from the Chief Executive Officer



Recent history is filled with heroic and humanitarian acts preventing the loss of health and life. The code breakers during WWII enabled the Allies to intercept messages from Nazi Germany. Understanding the structure of DNA and breaking its code promoted better health outcomes worldwide. During the COVID-19 pandemic, scientists feverishly (pardon the unintended pun) worked to break the code of the virus to produce a vaccine. VMC works daily to break the code of homelessness. The pandemic has further illustrated the value, the necessity for "safe places" – for home. Without being too dramatic, this 2020 Annual Report reflects the heroic work of "code breaking" by staff and volunteers during a world-wide pandemic. Our mission continued without interruption of services offered in a context of


recommended protocols and adjusting as needed.

**Street Outreach** continued engaging individuals throughout the community. To accommodate the need for quarantine and isolation of individuals who had direct contact with or a positive diagnosis of the virus but no place to shelter, VMC offered an opportunity called **The Guest House**.

**The Foyer** completed its first full year as fourteen (14) people achieved housing with three (3) more finding a home with family, friends and/or inpatient care while **Street Outreach** engaged over 400 people. **The Resource Center** assisted forty-six (46) people to find a permanent residence. To promote housing stability, the **Refuge** assisted 227 households with rent and/or utility assistance.

With an occupancy rate of 94% for 2020, **Minvilla Manor** completed its first decade of operation. Though suspending services for eight weeks due to the early days of the pandemic, the **Dental Clinic** reopened with a flourish.

Because of the dedicated and compassionate staff and volunteers and supporters like you, VMC was able to continue its "codebreaking" services of ending homelessness and promoting housing stability. One of our long-time and dedicated Board members identified the formula. Charlie Daniel's characterization through cartoon speaks for itself.



Again, many thanks for your support during a difficult, challenging, and eventful year for all.

# A Message from the Chairman of the Board

The VMC staff kept the doors open, greeted our neighbors with a smile (under a mask), provided meals, classes, and case management (Resource Center), offered shelter (The Foyer), clothing, IDs, rent and utility assistance (The Refuge), dental care (Dental Clinic), a safe place to recover from COVID (Guest House), and more. Talk about essential workers!

None of this would be possible without the help and support of generous donors and volunteers like you. Thank you.

As I walk through the VMC parking lot, I put my hand in my pocket to check for my keys and whisper a prayer that our neighbors will soon achieve housing and have a key to their own home.

# Our Programs — How You Helped Volun

## The Resource Center

Utilizing the "Housing First" model, the Resource Center is an evidence-based transitional day program utilizing case management services to assist people experiencing homelessness to attain affordable, permanent housing and to receive the additional skills and supportive services required to maintain that housing. It provides a safe and supportive daytime environment in which clients can access meals, showers, laundry, telephone, mail, computers, and classes on a variety of topics such as anger management, personal responsibility, alcohol and drug education, self-esteem, and basic life skills.



Participants in the Resource Center program meet regularly on Fridays to celebrate milestones to achieving housing.

### 2020 Resource Center Statistics

46 People achieved housing... They join the 1,079 who have been previously placed for a total of 1,125. Our housing retention rate is 96.4% measured after one year of housing. The national average is 85%.

# The Bush Family Refuge

Staffed primarily by trained volunteers, the Refuge (preventing homelessness) is the portal for assistance to individuals and families who may be at risk of losing their housing and for those who have fallen into homelessness. Services provided include financial assistance with rent and utilities, prescription medication, transportation assistance, procuring birth certificates and state-issued identification. Referrals to other services and agencies are made as appropriate.

- 2,043 total individuals served

# The VMC Dental Clinic

Located at our main campus, the VMC Dental Clinic has been providing oral health care to individuals experiencing homelessness and other impoverished individuals since 1998. Staffed by volunteer dental professionals, the VMC Dental

# Minvilla Manor

Providing a moderate supportive environment to former chronically homeless and disabled individuals, Minvilla Manor has 57 apartment units for single residents. The supportive services are "in-house" to assist and empower every resident with the objective of long term tenancy and to secure appropriate medical/behavioral services. Minvilla offers case management services on-site and twenty-four hour staffing. This ensures a high

level of security for the residents. Social activities are also provided. Created from the remains of the former Fifth Avenue Motel. the rehabilitated Minvilla Manor has been placed on the National Register of Historic Places.

. With so many COVID restrictions, Minvilla Manor residents are thrilled to be treated with an outdoor barbeque.

# Street Outreach Services & The Foyer

Street outreach workers engage the most service resistant of our homeless neighbors with the intent of connecting them to housing case management services. They also make referrals to the Foyer, a low-barrier housing-focused emergency overnight shelter for the most vulnerable homeless who, for



multiple reasons, are not accessing a traditional shelter. As an entrée to housing, the Fover provides

420 individuals engaged through Street Outreach. 145 individuals in overnight shelter at the Foyer.

overnight accommodations for 30-40 people, paired with direct and indirect access to social services. Accommodations for companion pets is also provided at the Foyer.

After engaging with street outreach workers Megan and Dyrl, Jeff became a member of the Resource Center program and achieved housing.

In 2010 I had the chance to do an international missions trip with my church. It was a great experience and helped me focus on the fact that there are great people who wind up in tough places during their lives.


When I returned home I had a new perspective. Knoxville was home, but I could no longer be ignorant of the great people in our town who were also struggling and in tough places.



# **2020 Highlights**

Although the pandemic altered VMC operations, there were successes in all program areas. 221 individuals experiencing homelessness were engaged in a case management relationship through the Resource Center. 227 households received assistance with rent/utilities through the Bush Family Refuge. There were 1,550 dental procedures in the Dental Clinic. Street Outreach case managers engaged 420 individuals throughout the City of Knoxville. 145 of the most vulnerable homeless received nightly shelter at the Foyer. 59 residents at Minvilla Manor received housing support services. And, 46 individuals experiencing homelessness at the beginning of 2020 had a home at the end of 2020 - that is something to celebrate - even during a pandemic!




